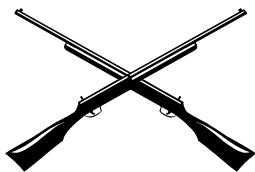


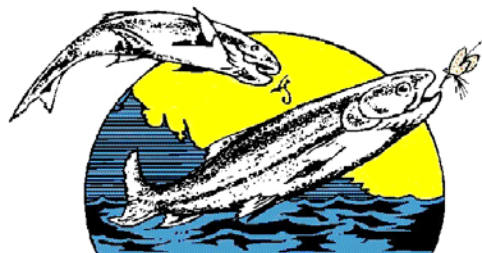

For those persons that are disabled or volunteering at the April fundraiser and would also like to shoot in the event we would ask that you please shoot Saturday March 28, 2009 at 11:00 A.M. one week before the actual event. Doing this early will help keep the event running smoothly on April 4th, so we can all remain at our work stations throughout the day. Also any trailers we will need for the disabled will not be in the way of getting in as many rounds as possible the day of the shoot. All shooters will also be eligible for the Lewis Class prizes. Thank you for your cooperation.

**Disabled shooters are also welcome to shoot the day of the event. We just felt that some would be more comfortable shooting when there was not such a crowd around.**

Hello CTO Supporters,

I'm Wayne Van Straten, Field Project Director for Shadows on the Wolf. Some of you know me as "Ace". I'm writing to give you an update on a couple of projects completed by Shadows this summer. Three new handicap accessible fishing piers were completed in the Village of Shiocton. These new piers add to the six previously installed at area county parks to bring the total to nine (9) that Shadows and others have installed in the last three years. All of the piers are 6 feet wide, have treated lumber for decking and all have a railing if 32" in height, making it easy to fist over the top of the railing. All of the piers are installed so the ends of them are over water throughout the year. The approaches to them are will maintained and gently sloped, so access is easy. Some are even blacktop approaches.

The locations of these fishing piers is as follows;

**Koepke Co Park** – 2 piers, large parking area, paved approaches from lot. Follow Hwy 76 North of Shiocton 2 miles to Co Rd M. Go right (North) on Co 1 ½ miles to Koepke Rd, Go right (East) approximated ¾ mile to Koepke Park.

**Village of Shiocton** – 2 piers, asphalt parking lot, paved approaches from lot. Located on Hwy 76 (Main St) in Shiocton immediately north of the Village Offices on the East side of the Wolf River (Downtown).

**Bamboo Bend** - 1 pier, gravel parking lot, gravel approach. Located at the intersection of Hwy 76 and Hwy 54 on the west edge of Shiocton. This pier will be excellent to view the spawning sturgeon in spring.

**Barker County Park** - 2 piers, gravel parking lot, paved approaches. Follow Hwy 54 west of Shiocton ½ mile to Old Hwy 54. Go south (left) approximately ¾ mile to Barker County Park.

**County "S" Co Park - Stephenville** - 2 piers, gravel parking lot, gravel approaches. Follow Hwy 76 south of Shiocton 5 miles to Co Rd S. Go right (west) on Co S approximately 1 ½ miles to entrance to Co Park (on right-north side). Follow access rod to parking area – fishing piers are located at the north end of the parking lot (on east side of river).

All these piers were installed for use by the general public, but it is our sincere wish that all able bodied sportsmen grant the right of way to out disadvantaged friends. Take a short drive around Shiocton this spring and check out the location of these new piers so you are ready to roll when the mood strikes to go fishing! Good Luck and Good Fishing!

## ALB Sponsoring a Learn To Turkey Hunt April 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup>

The Autumn Long Beards, NWTF Chapter from Clintonville, WI, are sponsoring a Learn to Turkey Hunt on April 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> of 2009. The hunt is open to youth from 12 to 17 and women who are 1<sup>st</sup> time turkey hunters who would not otherwise have an opportunity to hunt. As part of this program they also accept disabled youth. Here are the rules & guidelines:

### **RULES:**

Hunter applicant must have completed a hunter safety course by 3/31/09.

Hunter needs to be at least 12 years old by 4/5/09.

Hunter needs to obey the mentors and instructors. Bad behavior will not be tolerated, which will lead to removal of the participant from the program.

Hunter must attend a four hour long instruction class along with mentor on Saturday March 28, 2009. A make up training course may possibly be available on Friday, April 3, 2009, but this needs to be worked through with the program lead and person must have good reason for this change.

The participant will **NOT** need to purchase a turkey license/stamp and the DNR will supply a turkey tag during the training.

There will be a mentor for each person hunting. The mentor must have at least 5 years of turkey hunting experience and can't have a criminal history. The chapter will provide a mentor and/or land. There will also be a mentor's assistant bringing the hunting group to three persons. **Usually the mentor's assistant is one of the parents or a close relative.** The program will also provide an assistant mentor if needed in case the parents are unable to attend the hunt.

All hunting will be done on private lands. The local chapter will provide land if the hunter has none available to them. The program coordinator is always looking for land to use for this program. Hunters are encouraged to ask relatives or friends to allow them to hunt on their land. This land will only be limited to that one designated hunting group.

The lands will be identified to the DNR before the outing occurs so that law enforcement will be aware of what land is active in the youth hunt. The DNR needs to know this information in case of any reports of violating comes in they can let the reporter know of the youth hunt.

**The class will have a limited amount of spaces available.** The local chapter will devise a way to choose fairly if we get more applicants than what we can support.

Participants are asked to attend a **free** picnic sponsored by the NWTF on Saturday the weekend of the hunt. Successful youth hunters from the morning will bring their turkeys to the picnic, so others can see the turkeys.

Each youth hunter (boys & girls ages 12-17) must purchase a NWTF JAKES membership for the current year from the chapter. The cost is \$5.00 and will be collected during the training day. The membership includes a JAKES magazine subscription. The JAKES membership also includes an invitation to a free JAKES day picnic held in July.

Any adult women hunters (age 18+) is encouraged to purchase a NWTF Women in the Outdoors (WITO) membership for the current year. The cost of this membership is \$30.00 and will be collected during the training day. If they elect not to purchase a WITO membership, they must at least sponsor a JAKES membership for \$7. The WITO membership includes a magazine subscription to the Women in the Outdoors - NWTF. The WITO membership also includes Autumn Longbeards chapter membership perks such as free seedling trees & shrubs and seed.

The deadline for applying is March 1<sup>st</sup> but applications will likely be accepted a week or so past that date until they reach capacity. The disabled youth program is nearly full already but there are 2 openings remaining. ## **Field Grants Program Guidelines Challenge the Outdoors, Inc**

At the September, 2007 BOD meeting, revisions were discussed and approved for the CTO Field Grant Program. The program is designed to aid physically challenged members of Challenge the Outdoors, Inc to experience once-in-a-lifetime outdoor recreational events that they can not otherwise afford to attend. To be eligible to apply and receive funding under the Field Grant Program, an individual must be a disabled member of Challenge the Outdoors, Inc for at least one calendar year.

These grants (a maximum of \$200.00) are not available to non-disabled members of CTO.

A Field Grant will not be awarded to an individual for participation in another organization's event if CTO already conducts a similar event. The Field Grant Committee and Board of Directors can consider an exception under special circumstances. Persons that have received funds under the CTO Field Grant Program are not be eligible for another Field Grant to participate in the same type of event in the future. For example: A disabled member of Challenge the Outdoors is awarded a Field Grant to hunt Pronghorn in Wyoming. This member may not apply for another Field Grant to hunt pronghorn in the future.

### **Cost Sharing Program for Adaptive Equipment Catching on**

We know adaptive equipment can be a bit pricey so our hope, by creating this cost sharing program in December of 2004, was to help our physically challenged members offset that cost and encourage them to purchase their own equipment. Thus creating more independence for them. So far CTO has helped several members purchase adaptive hunting equipment including crossbows and hand cranks, and an adapted gunstock. We are still waiting for the 1<sup>st</sup> adaptive fishing equipment request. For those unfamiliar with our cost sharing program here's how it works. **CTO will help our physically challenged members purchase adaptive hunting or fishing equipment by picking up to ½, but not to exceed \$100.00, for the cost of the piece(s) of equipment 1 time per year.** For example say Jane purchases a crank for her crossbow and it cost \$150.00. CTO would reimburse Jane \$75.00. To receive reimbursement for a piece of adaptive equipment you have purchased or to see if a piece of equipment you're considering purchasing qualifies contact Jean or Harland Chapman. (920) 525-1123. **\*Note, keep your receipt and get a duplicate copy of the original because we will need a copy for our records. And if you return the item please reimburse CTO.** If you are looking for sources of adaptive equipment there are hundreds to choose from so shop around and check our website out for links to sellers and suppliers and as always please show patronage to the many businesses that have been so good to us over the years by giving them your and our business.
